THIS WEEKS PROGRAM

Lion Neil Graeff introduced **Wendell Williams**, Chairman of the Temple Health and BioScience Board of Directors, and **Dr. Wally Dyck**, Senior Advisor to the Board. The mission of the District is to grow 21st Century jobs and promote bioscience education, research, and healthcare in Central Texas. The board of seven directors was formed in 2003 and is voted on every three years. Their bios and a short video presentation can be viewed at www.templebioscience.com. Mr. Williams compares the purpose of this district to the formation of the Temple Industrial Foundation in the 1950s. That endeavor brought businesses to Temple such as McLane, Mobil Chemical (Pactiv), and Wilson Art, just to name a few. These companies brought jobs to Temple and Central Texas and became strong community partners. The Bioscience District through the Texas Bioscience Institute on Scott & White's west campus, looks to do the same in the healthcare fields. World class researchers have relocated to this campus for cancer and stem cell research. The Institute offers a middle college where high school students can earn dual credits and accelerate healthcare training. This will improve educational and employment opportunities. There will be an open house with public tours on April 26 from 1 to 5pm. There will be an election on May 9 granting Ad Valorem taxing authority to the district. The maximum amount allowed is 15 cents per \$100 property value but the board intends to apply a 2.5 cent tax rate that will be frozen for Seniors. There are restrictions as to the rate at which it may be increased and board members are subject to election. Personally, I suggest you go to the website, watch the video, and review the benefits
