Last week, Dr. Bobby Ott joined us via Zoom to provide an update on Temple I.S.D. He indicated that the district sends out weekly communication to students and parents via email to check on students. For remote learning, students are able to get weekly lesson packets via email or opt for a printed packet. The participation rate for students engaging in remote learning across the district is 90%. Dr. Ott also told us that the district is still offering food service to its students, including packets for the weekend. He said as of last week, T.I.S.D. had distributed over 7,000 breakfast meals and over 21,000 lunches. Dr. Ott said he is truly grateful for the Food Service staff and all they are doing to continue feeding students.

Regarding the various T.I.S.D. construction projects that are currently underway, the new fine arts center on 31st Street is almost complete. They are currently working on the new swim center, and flipping Lamar Middle School to face 3rd Street. The goal is for each middle school to have their own competition field as well. Finally, the old scoreboard was set to come down last week, so construction can begin on the new scoreboard.

Twelve of the T.I.S.D. school nurses have volunteered to help Baylor Scott & White during this time.

As parents, students, faculty, and staff are unable to gather together in person, the annual athletic and academic banquets will be held virtually to honor students.

For the Temple High graduation, it has been moved to June 14th. If limitations on gatherings are still in place, it will be a virtual graduation. As a back-up plan, Dr.

Ott indicated that Bell County Expo Center has also been booked for August 8th with hopes to have an in-person graduation ceremony in case the only option for June 14th is a virtual ceremony.



Regarding summer learning, the city of Temple has agreed to let T.I.S.D. use the city's tv channel to present lessons. Dr. Ott also indicated that if learning for next year continues to be remote, the city of Temple has offered to let the district continuing using their channel offer lessons.
