Today, Coach Pete Fredenburg, the UMHB Head Football Coach, volunteered his time to speak to our club.

Coach Fredenburg has been at UMHB for 22 years. He began his career in Texas as a high school coach across several schools, including Canyon High School, New Braunfels High School, and Giddings High School. He has

coached more than twenty players who have played professional football. After starting the UMHB football program in 1998, over 21 years ago, it took Fredenburg only four seasons to take the Cru to the NCAA Division III playoffs and just five years for him to quide the Cru to an American Southwest Conference championship. In only his seventh season of UMHB football, Coach Fredenburg took his team to the NCAA Division III National Championship game. The 2016 season saw UMHB's first NCAA Division III National Championship over Wisconsin-Oshkosh with a 10 to 7 victory!!! The UMHB football team finished as NCAA national runner-up in 2004 and 2017. Currently, UMHB has the largest group of football players ever coming into Fredenburg's program because of the success they have had over the last 3 years. There are so many players who want to be a part of the UMHB program. Coach Fredenburg reiterated the importance of being proactive about concussions—26 players had concussions last year. When this happens, each player is tested reaction time assessments and must pass these tests before they are allowed to play again.

The 2018 National Championship game was held in Shenandoah, Texas with the largest crowd since 1971.

The Cru defeated Mount Union with a close game...24 to 16. The 2019 National Championship will again be held in Shenandoah, Texas. Hopefully the Cru will be there yet again! GO CRU!!!
