**THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM:** Lion Tailtwister Fette introduced wife Pam, who intro'ed our program. James Melone is the new principal at St Mary's and Chris Mosmeyer is the principal at Holy Trinity and is starting his 10<sup>th</sup> year there. Their schools started earlier this week. Catholic schools have a 99% graduation rate and 90% of students attend college. "But our Mission is not to get a student in college but into heaven". St Mary's students attend mass at least 2 times a week and once a month with students from Holy Trinity. Holy Trinity has been the State Champs in academics for the past 5 years, and Dist. Champs for 7. Along with academics, Catholic schools stress service to the Church, the community, and being a whole person. Students come from all over central TX and 30% are non-Catholics. St Mary's has 236 students in grades 1 to 8, and Holy Trinity has 85 students in grades 9 to 12. St Mary's tuition is about \$4,000 a year, and Holy Trinity is \$8,500. Holy Trinity will provide \$130,000 in financial aid to students this year. 36% of its students receive some financial aid. The new facilities for Holy Trinity are expected to be on line this coming summer. The first of its 3 major fund raisers will be a golf tournament on 9/12. Thanks Lion Fette, Pam, and Principals Melone and Mossmeyer.
