## THIS WEEKS PROGRAM

Lion John Francis introduced former Judge and fellow Attorney Ken Law who shared his passion for studying Rock Art of the Lower Pecos. Because his time was limited and the subject is vast, Mr. Law encouraged us to visit [www.rockart.org](http://www.rockart.org) for more information on this fascinating topic.

14,000 years ago, tribes from Siberia began migrating to North America and some ended up in the Lower Pecos region of Texas in 12,000 BP. For the next 4,000 years there existed large mammals such as woolly mammoths, mastodons, and bison (stood as high as 8ft unlike the bison today). Mr. Law brought an atlatl which was the primary hunting weapon of the day. The people practiced Shamanism which was an animistic religion that guided their culture and virtually every aspect of their daily lives. It was based on the belief that they existed in an imperfect world but that there was a perfect world on the other side that could only be visited by entering a deep meditation. Certain tribe members underwent intense training to become a shaman, a person who could visit the other side to find answers and bring them back to the tribe. The art from this time contains many metaphoric symbols that can be linked to shamanistic beliefs. Drawings often depicted good and evil spirits and animals such as panthers and birds travelling to and from the spiritual world. Their art was powerful in that it reflected their decision-making on every level. Mr. Law showed us five kinds of rock art: Pecos River, red linear, red monochrome, historic, and petroglyph. Petroglyph consists of etchings or images chipped into the rock, not paintings.
