Today, the Bell County Commissioner, Precinct 3, Bill Schumann, spoke to TFLC about the state of Bell County following the 86th Texas legislative session. He gave us an overview of the 1,500 bills passed into law (of the 7,700 filed) during the 86th Texas legislative session. Many of the bills relate to Child Protective Services (CPS), the jail system, mental health, and indigent health. He focused on those particular bills that from the outset seemed to save taxpayers money, but lead to increase in cost for each county. Schumann is in his second



term as county commissioner. As commissioner, his job duties include being responsible for the building and maintenance of county roads and bridges in his precinct; setting and adopting the county's budget and tax rate; approving purchases; filling vacancies in elected and ap-



pointed offices; and maintaining all county buildings. Thank you Commissioner Schumann for taking the time to come speak to TFLC today, and for the update on the status of Bell County!
