Today, Immediate Past District Governor Lion Lisle Meeker visited TFLC for a brief presentation. Today, the director of the Czech Heritage Museum, Susan Chandler, gave TFLC a little Czech history lesson and talked about the museum. She told us that the museum hous-

es artifacts and produces programs which tell three categories of stories. These include the history and rich culture of the Czech lands from 500 C.E. to present; the story of Czech immigrants in Texas from 1850 to the early 1900s; and the story of Czech-Americans connecting with their identi-



ties and families during the Cold War and in today's Czech Republic. The museum is a small niche museum located on the border of the central business district and the historic residence district of Temple, Texas. It is housed in a mosaic-tiled 1931 store front located on a main artery through town. Although the museum was established as a nonprofit entity in 2000, the collection itself had been accumulating since 1963 under the name of the SPJST Library, Archives, and Museum. The SPJST is a fraternal organization in



Texas started by Czech immigrants in the 1800s. The museum opened its current location in 2001 next door to the SPJST home office. The museum is open Tuesdays through Saturdays 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Thank you, Susan, for taking the time to speak to our club!
