Today, Kim White with Bridge East Temple spoke to TFLC about the 411 House. The 411 House, which officially opened August 2019, provides young boys (aged 9 to 16) who reside in the neighborhood a place to come and fellowship with peers and adults who care about them, and also learn life skills. Kim and her husband, Jeff, came up with the idea for the 411 House, and they were able to secure a \$40,000 grant from Chip and Joanna Gaines to help support this endeavor.

They also received pledges for materials and in-kind donations to rebuild the rooms, including drywall, hardware, appliances, flooring, labor, and roofing services to complete the renovations of the 411 S. 32nd Street home in east Temple. Their mission is simple, yet powerful: to provide hope and support for young people who need it. In addition to learning life skills, the

youth have access to James Wilson Park, which is located nearby. There, the youth are able to enjoy water parks, football games, and other activities. Kim also told us what the current needs are for the 411 House. The priority needs are two, 15-passenger vans, male mentors who commit to volunteering their time twice each month, monthly financial support, hosting a fundraising event, and other service opportunities including yard work, house maintenance, and housekeeping.
