THIS WEEKS PROGRAM

Lion Past President Sam Farrow introduced David Yeilding, Ph.D.. Dr. Yeilding's teaching career includes several high schools, Odessa College, and Central Texas College where he spent 30 years teaching history and government until his full retirement in 2006.

The Declaration of Independence, along with The Constitution, and The Bill of Rights, are the only documents of their kind that were created at the same time as the government. Most documents like this are not drawn until several years after a government is established. On July 4, 1776, 200 copies of the Declaration were printed on parchment and sent out to the colonies to be read. Only 25 remain. The original circulated with the 2nd Continental Congress as it traveled. It followed our nation's capitol from New York to Philadelphia to Washington D.C.. It traveled from there back to Philadelphia in 1876, to the Library of Congress in 1922, to Fort Knox, and to its current home, the National Archives, in 1952. From 2001 to 2003, \$136 million was spent rehabilitating the document.

The Declaration was a collaborative effort from it's committee of Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, Ben Franklin, Roger Sherman, and Robert Livingston and was inspired by British Philosopher John Locke and the Virginia Declaration of Rights, written by George Mason. It has captured for generations the imaginations of local and foreign governments. Happy 232nd birthday! Excellent program.
