On January 1, 2014 Curbside Recycling was implemented city-wide in Temple. There are approximately 24,000 residential customers participating.

Temple is fortunate to be able to participate in Single Stream Recycling which means we don't have to separate our recyclables' before pick up.

Major no-no's for your recycle bin: Styrofoam, green glass, motor oil or antifreeze, paint cans, diapers, aluminum foil, electronics and yard waste.

Plastic bags can not be recycled through the City's program, but HEB and other retailers will gladly take them back.
