Leroy is the first TFLC lunch program speaker to be "mugged" by our new TFLC Prez, Shannon Gowan.

Our program this week was our very own TFLC member, Retired Special Operations Captain Leroy Vargas. While working as a firefighter for 35 years, Leroy served as the Senior Advanced Provider of the first ever Critical Incident Stress Management Team. He was also served as director of EMS programs for Scott & White, Director of Medical Jets International and crew chief flight paramedic for UMS out of Fort Hood. Leroy currently works for the Texas A&M Engineering Extension as an adjunct faculty member. His family is comprised of several first responders, including his wife who is a flight nurse and his son and daughter, who are both firefighters. Over the years there are numerous high profile events he has responded to: Fort Hood shootings, Jarrell Tornado, Branch Davidian standoff, West, Texas explosion, Luby's massacre and Bryan Firefighters tragedy. His program covered the ways that being involved in these tragic events affect the people that are first responders as well as those close to the victims or responders. Leroy also informed us that First Responders are 10 times as likely to commit suicide than civilians.
