Celebrating its 50th year in Temple, the CAC offers programs and classes for all ages. Classes include classical guitar, glass fusing, dance, and working with clay, taught by Lion Bob Ritchie's lovely bride, Marilyn, Visual Arts Director.

The CAC has five art galleries and will be hosting an art exhibit on August 15th with a wine a cheese event to kick things off. The show will represent all types of media that range from clay to photographic to paintings. Admission is free to the public.

The performing arts season will consist of five shows: A Johnny Cash Tribute in September, Bagpipes and Blarney in November, The Harlem Gospel Choir in February 2009, followed by the Glenn Miller Orchestra and David Holt's American Music, both in March 2009.
