#### THIS WEEKS PROGRAM

Lion Jerry Tyroch, Jr. introduced **Dr. Glenda Barron**, President of Temple College. Temple college has experienced tremendous growth (24%) over the last two years and that growth is creating challenges in regards to classroom space, staffing, faculty, and parking. The average age of students at the Temple Campus is 26 and number approximately 5200. there are over 780 students at the Taylor campus and the average age is 27. Cameron has 325 but is mainly comprised of students who are either taking dual credit courses in high school or have recently graduated. Temple College offers a Middle College at the Temple BioScience Institute and currently has 148 juniors and seniors from 14 area high schools. These students are heavily recruited by colleges and some have recently received full scholarships from Harvard. Taylor offers a program whereby high school students use dual credit courses to earn an associates degree by the time they graduate high school. The temple campus sports a state of the art science building with 10 labs that offer more biology and chemistry courses than most public universities. The Mary Alice Marshall Concert hall is undergoing renovation to add lobby space, bathrooms, a rehearsal hall, and offices. TC has received a \$400, 000 grant for workforce development to train 300 workers on new technology at Texas Hydraulics, who in turn will open 40 new positions. "Closing the Gaps" is a state initiative to educate 630,000 additional students between years 2000 and 2015. The current enrollment pattern indicates that we are falling 33% behind in educating the Hispanic sector and at the current rate Texas' education demographic will be similar to that of third world countries. Informative program.
