THIS WEEKS PROGRAM

Lion Tom Fairlie introduced Dr. Benjamin Irom and the Temple College Jazz Combo. These very talented young men hail from Temple, Killeen, Cameron, and Austin, a good representation of the areas TC serves. Lion Tom talked about the upcoming 19th Annual Temple College Jazz Festival, a program Lion Tom began when he began as Director of Music in 1990. The Festival will begin Thursday March 26 with TC's Jazz Fusion followed by Jazz Vocalist Suzi Stern. March 27 performances will include the TC Jazz ensemble, directed by Dr. Benjamin Irom, and featuring trombonist Bill Watrous. Saturday March 28 will feature Director Tom Fairlie and the Temple Jazz Orchestra along with trumpeter Randy Brecker. All these concerts will be held at the Mary Alice Marshall Performing Arts Auditorium on the TC campus at 7:30pm. Admission for each event is \$5 for students and \$20 for adults. Passes for all 3 days are \$10 for students and \$40 for adults. For more information (what more do you need to know) call 298-8555. Dr. Irom and the Temple Jazz combo performed Clifford Brown's "Daahoud", Earl Zindar's "How My Heart Sings", and Brontislav Kaper's "Invitation."
