What happened at the Meeting



Gayle Kiger, **President and** General Manager of KCEN TV— Channel 6 came and spoke to our group.

KCEN TV signed on the air for the first time on November 1, 1953, originally owned by Frank W May-

born, publisher of the Temple Daily Telegram and owner of KTEM radio (1400AM) in Temple. Early on, Mayborn realized that Temple-Killeen and Waco were going to be a single television market (although, then as now, they are separate radio markets). To signify that his new station would service all of Central Texas, Mayborn decided on the call letters KCEN-TV (the calls standing for "CENtral Texas"), rather than KTEM-TV (for TEMple), after his radio station property. He also built his studio near Eddy, roughly halfway between Temple and Waco.

Kiger was instrumental in bringing the operations to Temple, saying, "We really believe that there would be no better home for KCEN than in the city of Temple".

The offices and studio are now in the former First Baptist Church complex on 3rd street in Temple.

Did you Know? April Fools!

Some historians believe the April Fools' customs began in France, although no one knows for sure.

It may stem from a calendar change in 16th century France, the moving of New Year's Day from April 1 to January 1 when the Gregorian calendar was adopted.

People who continued to celebrate New Year's Day on April 1st, rather than the new date of January 1st were referred to as "April Fools".
