The origin of the word "jazz" is believed to be related to "jasm" - a slang term dating back to 1860 meaning "pep" or "energy." The earliest written use of that word was in a 1912 LA Times article wherein a minor league pitcher described a crazy pitch as a "jazz ball" because it wobbles and you can't do anything with it.
