

board and Temple College board had a joint meeting at the beginning of the 2019-2020 school year. TISD has implemented district-wide blended learning and further expanded CTE partnerships. For priority #3, Safety, Dr. Ott told us that the district has hired another student intervention specialist, im-



plemented a security service assessment protocol, started the Keep TISD Safe initiative, as well as made several technology upgrades. One of the new priorities (#4), Growth, has been addressed with the first-ever school demographic study, which was completed last year. He said that the district plans to continue this every year as it provides such valuable information. He also mentioned that the district is working with builders on master planning for housing developments, and working with the Temple-Belton Board of Realtors. Finally, he discussed Compensation (#5) and the increase in employee salaries across the district. TISD conducted an indepth salary study by position, years of expertise, and district size. He reported that the current salary for TISD's new-to-profession teacher salary is \$50,225. Thank you Dr. Ott for such a thorough update on the district and its priorities!
