Today, we had the Bell County Youth Fair representatives speak to TFLC. The Bell County Youth Fair has been at the Bell County Expo Center for 32 years now. Sherry Tyroch provided updated information for the 2020 Bell County Youth Fair. The dates for the 2020 Youth Fair will begin on Saturday, February 1st. She wanted to point out that the Steer Show is changing and will be on Sunday night, and the Heifer Show will be on Sunday as well. The Hamburger Supper that TFLC helps sponsor will be on Tuesday, February 4th, 2020. Sherry expressed her gratitude to TFLC for all we do with the Hamburger Supper. Apparently, this is a highlight for many of the students. About 12 years ago, a group was formed to allocate scholarships to the students who participate in the Bell County Youth Fair. The first year, the highest scholarship was \$4,000, and now the largest scholarship is \$10,000. One of the ways the scholarship program is supported is through the Chisholm Trail Christmas Ball, which is a fundraiser that includes live music, dinner, and dancing each December to raise money to support the student scholarship program. The Bell County Youth Fair Scholarship Program was launched in 2007, and has since awarded over \$500,000 in scholarships to students who have shown commitment to the Bell County Youth Fair. One of the former scholarship recipients was available to speak today. She reiterated the significance of the Hamburger Supper, the opportunity it provides for students to visit with each other, and the memories it creates. She also mentioned how important the Bell County Youth Fair was to her life and how it contributed to her success today. The scholarship was a great opportunity and supported her as she pursued her degree at Texas A&M University. The Hamburger Supper was one of the things she mentioned was most important to her at the Bell County Youth Fair, as it provided the students an opportunity to visit and socialize with one another. She also mentioned as part of her job, she attends various other youth fairs across the state. She indicated that the Bell County Youth Fair is competitive across the state at shows on a larger level.
