Our speakers today were from University of Mary Hardin-Baylor. Mark Moorefield is in his first season as the head women's basketball coach and Rebecca Neuger is in her first season as the assistant coach. Mark spent eight highly successful seasons as an assistant coach for the men's basketball program at Baylor University. He helped guide the Bears to two NCAA tournament appearances, including a spot in the Elite Eight. Mark also coached three future NBA players, including two first-round draft picks during his tenure at Baylor. Mark is a graduate of Valparaiso University. He and his wife, the Danika, have two sons.

Rebecca joined UMHB after spending one year as a graduate manager for the Baylor University men's basketball program. She also spent two years as a high school coach in her native state of Minnesota. She was an academic All-American in track and earned a total of 14 varsity letters in four different sports during her athletic career.
