Today, Chris Del Conte, the University of Texas Vice President & Director of Athletics, made the trek to Temple to speak to our club. It was an energetic, fascinating, and very entertaining talk! He spoke about his wife, Dr. Robin Ward, who is a math professor at Rice University, and his two daughters. He has strong ties to the Lone Star State, having spent a dozen years at TCU and Rice before taking over leadership of Texas Athletics on December 9, 2017. He definitely didn't hold back his feelings when TFLC members asked questions about NCAA rules, paying college athletes, his role at UT and his previous position at TCU, the pressure associated with his job, and of course, Longhorn football! He told us how grateful he is for sports as it provided him a way to be-

as it provided him a way to become something more and be where he is today. After being raised in a foster group home in New Mexico, Del Conte was a student-athlete at UC Santa Barbara where he received his B.A. in sociology. He would later get a master's degree in education, administration, and supervision from



Washington State. He has 28 years of experience as a collegiate administrator. The following are the words that sit behind Del Conte's desk, the same message that sat behind his father's desk, that he strives to live by and remember each day. "People are often unreasonable, illogical and selfcentered: forgive them anyway. If you are kind, people may accuse you of selfish, ulterior motives: be kind anyway. If you are successful, vou'll win some false friends and some true enemies: succeed anyway. If you are honest and frank, people may cheat you: be honest and frank anyway. What you spend years building, someone could destroy overnight: build anyway. If you find serenity and happiness, they may be jealous: be happy anyway. The good you do today, people will often forget tomorrow: do good anyway. Give the world the best you have, and it may never be enough: give the world the best you've got anyway. You see, in the final analysis, it is between you and God: it was never between you and them anyway."
