Pete Fredenburg came to the TFLC lunch meeting this past Wednesday. He is currently the head coach at the University of Mary Hardin–Baylor in Belton, Texas, a position he has held since the 1998 season when the program began play. His overall head coaching record stands at 210 wins and 39 losses, including 36 wins and 15 losses in the NCAA D-III Playoffs. Coach Fredenburg led Mary Hardin–Baylor to the NCAA Division III Football Championship in 2016. His 2004 squad finished as runnersup, losing to Linfield. Before coming to Mary Hardin–Baylor, Fredenburg served as an assistant coach at Baylor University (1982–1993), Louisiana State University(1994), and Louisiana Tech University (1995–1996). He played football at Southwest Texas State University—now known as Texas State University—San Marcos—from 1968 to 1970.

This was Coach Fredenburg's 21st year to speak at one of our lunch meetings. He let us know that the UMHB Football team will have their first home game this Saturday against Southwestern University. Also, on the offensive side of the ball, the team features a speedy group of running backs that help score points in a hurry. They have outscored their opponents 206-28 through the first 3 games!!!

Fredenburg talked about some of the rule changes which are mainly geared towards preventing concussions, such a new helmet safety requirements. He informed us that even the NFL had to replace over 200 helmets due to substandard design.

We were also informed that this year and next year's NCAA D-III Football National Championship Game will be played in Shenandoah, Texas at Woodforest Bank Stadium. UMHB will be the host institution. We would like to thank Coach Fredenburg for coming to speak at our lunch meeting. Take a look at the remaining games this season and come out and support UMHB.
