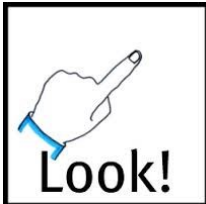

## This Week's Program



**Dr. Sonja Swiger, Associate Professor and Extension Entomologist, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service** spoke to our Lions Club this week. Dr. Swiger brought us timely information concerning the Zika virus.

- Zika virus disease is caused by a virus transmitted primarily by *Aedes* mosquitoes.
- People with Zika virus disease can have symptoms including mild fever, skin rash, conjunctivitis, muscle and joint pain, malaise or headache. These symptoms normally last for 2-7 days.

There is scientific consensus that Zika virus is a cause of microcephaly and Guillain-Barré syndrome. Links to other neurological complications are also being investigated.

Protection against mosquito bites is a key measure to prevent Zika virus infection. This can be done by wearing clothes that cover as much of the body as possible; using physical barriers such as window screens or closing doors and windows; and using insect repellent containing DEET. Special attention and help should be given to those who may not be able to protect themselves adequately, such as young children, the sick or elderly.

It is important to cover, empty or clean potential mosquito breeding sites in and around houses such as buckets, drums, pots, gutters, and used tires.
