Today, Dr. Phil Davis, spoke to the club about Canine Companions for Independence. This program is very dear to Dr. Davis as he is also currently training a Canine Companion hopeful named Journey!

Since 1975, Canine Companions has been enhancing the lives of people with disabilities by providing highly-trained assistance dogs to adults, children, veterans, and professionals who qualify for the program. Adults with disabilities are partnered with service or hearing dogs to increase their independence with daily tasks. Children with a range of



disabilities are paired with assistance dogs to help them perform physical tasks and to help increase their social opportunities. Wounded veterans and veterans with disabilities are matched with assistance dogs for greater independence. Assistance dogs are also partnered with working professions in a health care, visitation, criminal justice, or education setting, like Lorenzo, the facility dog at McLane Children's hospital. Canine Companions for Independence is a non-profit organization. Dr. Davis told us that Journey will stay with him for a total of 18 months, then go on to the formal training facility in Irving in May 2020, where she will stay and train until graduation in February 2021. If Journey is successful, she will be an assistance dog for a very lucky individual for 8 years! What an awesome job! Thank you Dr. Davis!
