Today, our very own District Governor John Noles visited TFLC to provide an update on the current happenings of District 2-X3. He told us about the goal for increasing membership for the district this year by 88 new members, which equates to about 2 members per club. We are currently at 49 new members for the year so far. That said, he feels strongly about our ability to achieve that goal for the year. District Governor Noles



told us how he would like to see the clubs that are healthy and successful, like TFLC, providing guidance to other clubs that may be struggling. He discussed his motto "Seek the spirit of Lionism" and how it underlies the reason we all joined the Lions Club; to serve. District Governor Noles reported that there are two new clubs

being chartered in District 2-X3 for this year, one in Athens, Texas and the second location is still being considered. He also reinforced the importance of clubs

engaging in service projects. The service goal for the district is to reach 280,000 people with 26,000 of those being youth aged 18 years and under. The 49 clubs in District 2-X3 will complete 850 service projects, and of those, 500 will address our major categories: pediatric cancer, diabetes, environmental, hunger, and vision.
