Today, TFLC welcomed Joy Summer-Smith, Associate Director of the Dr. Pepper Museum, and Chris Dyer, President & CEO of the Dr. Pepper Museum, to speak to us about the history of Dr. Pepper and the Museum. The Dr Pepper Museum & Free Enterprise Institute is located in Waco, Texas and is the home of the Nation's oldest major soft drink. The Museum is housed in the 1906 Artesian Manufacturing and Bottling Company building located in downtown Waco. The building formally opened to the public on May 11, 1991. At that time, only a small portion of the ground level was open to the public. During the next six years, the Museum embarked on three additional construction phases until



the entire building was restored and opened in May 1997. The Museum employs a staff of museum professionals and educators that work with the Board of Directors to fulfill the Museum's mission. The Museum has an annual operating budget of approximately \$500,000 that it



derives from contributions, memberships, admissions, and the sale of merchandise through its for-profit subsidiary, DP Museum Enterprises. At the time it opened to the public, the Museum's collection of artifacts totaled approximately 1,600. To-

day, that collection includes over 300,000 artifacts. In May of 2016, the East Wing Building opened to the public with new gift shop and soda fountain spaces, and the Emerson Holt – Ted Getterman Exhibit Gallery. Thank you so much for taking the time to speak to us today!
