Tara Stafford is the Director of Community Benefit-CTX for Baylor Scott & White and came to speak at the TFLC lunch meeting on Wednesday September 12th.

Her work revolves around state and federal regulations and reporting requirements for non-profit hospitals. She works with the Tax and Government Affairs Departments to manage the Community Benefit process for the Central Texas Division. Tara's responsibilities include overseeing the assessment of health needs in the communities served, implementing new programs or supporting existing ones to meet identified health needs, tracking and reporting work that counts as community benefit being done within each hospital entity, and managing the community benefit policy that guides community donations.

Mrs. Stafford informed us that in 2017, Baylor Scott and White Health reported \$866.8 Million in community benefit which includes charity care and programs that improve the health and well-being of our community. Baylor Scott and White also invested \$199.2 million in the Temple region alone for community benefit in the most recent state report (FY17).

Research-BSWH staffs more than 600 employees, including scientists, laboratory assistants, research nurses, clinical research assistants and research coordinators. They also utilize more than 243,000 square feet of research space and are conducting more than 2,000 active research protocols, spanning more than 58 medical specialties.

Education-BSWH is one of the nations largest teaching hospitals. There are 7,500 Active Physicians, 885 employed Advanced Practice professionals, approximately 800 Residents and Fellows in 50 specialties and has partnerships with: Texas A&M Health Science Center, UHMB School of Nursing and Temple College Nursing.

BSWH is concerned with Community Health Needs and regularly completes a Community Health Needs Assessment to identify concerns in each community they serve. They are specifically targeting Chronic Disease Management (Cancer & Heart Disease/Stroke), Mental Health Resources, Obesity, Access to Care, Pediatric Asthma Hospitalization and Tobacco Use for the Temple Region.
